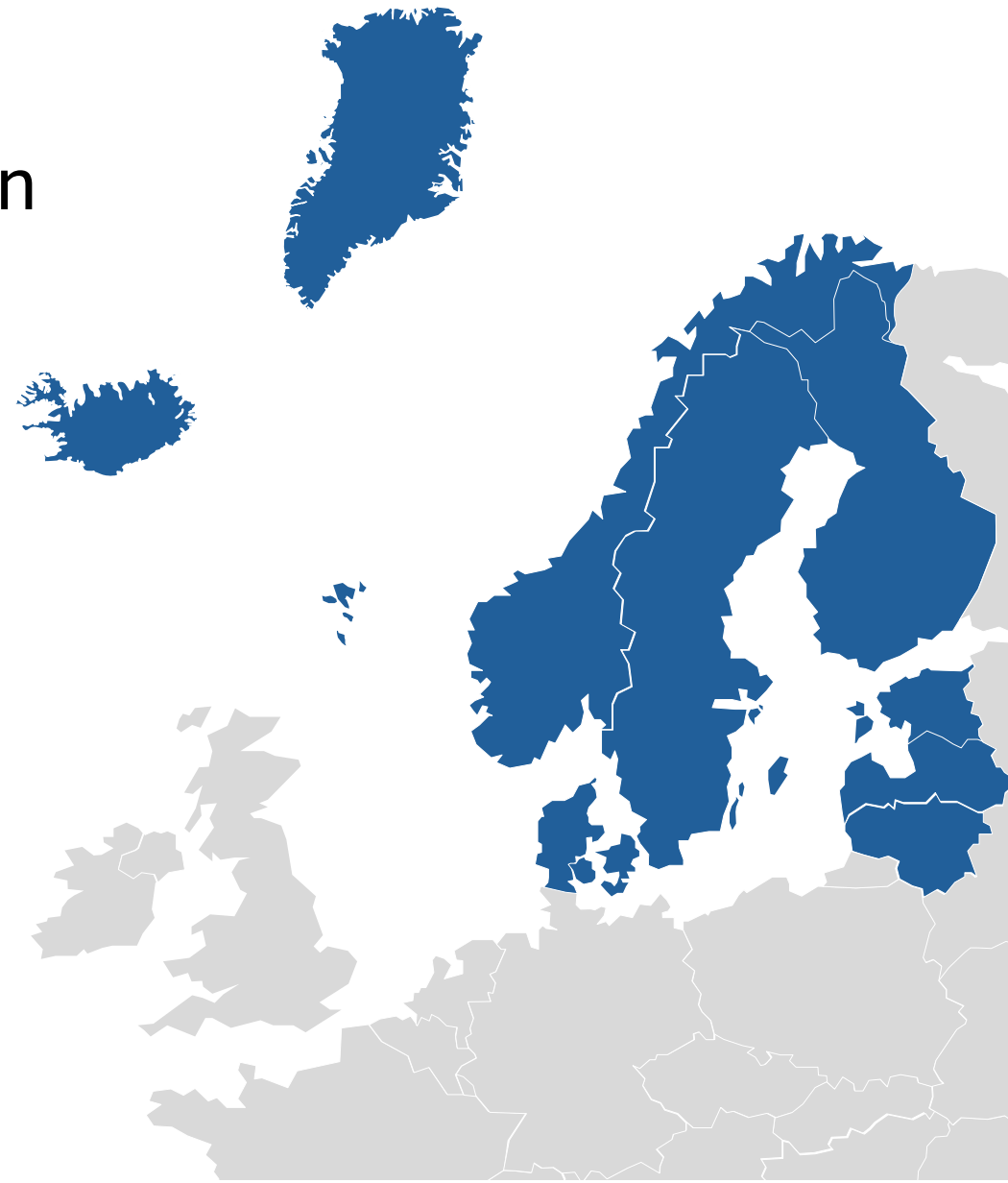

Nordic-Baltic eID (NOBID) Cooperation

- Collaborative arena under the Nordic Council of Ministers for digitalisation (MR-DIGITAL)
- Supported by national ministries and agencies responsible for digitalisation and eID across the Nordic-Baltic region
- Consist of appointed experts from each country that takes part in different working groups and sub-projects
- Managed by Norwegian Digitalisation Agency





Main goal:


Make it possible for citizens in the region to use their eID from their home country to access digital services in another country in the region

NCM Vision 2030



Identity matching

- A necessity for cross-border access to online services
- Something all EU/EEA countries need to solve in line with the eIDAS regulation
- Current national solutions to identity matching is a rarity, manual, demanding, and ill suited to match IDs on scale, and with high success rates
- The roll-out of National identity wallets (EUDIW) will not solve cross-border access in the absence of harmonized concepts for solving identity matching
- What data to share and match on needs to be harmonised between the countries



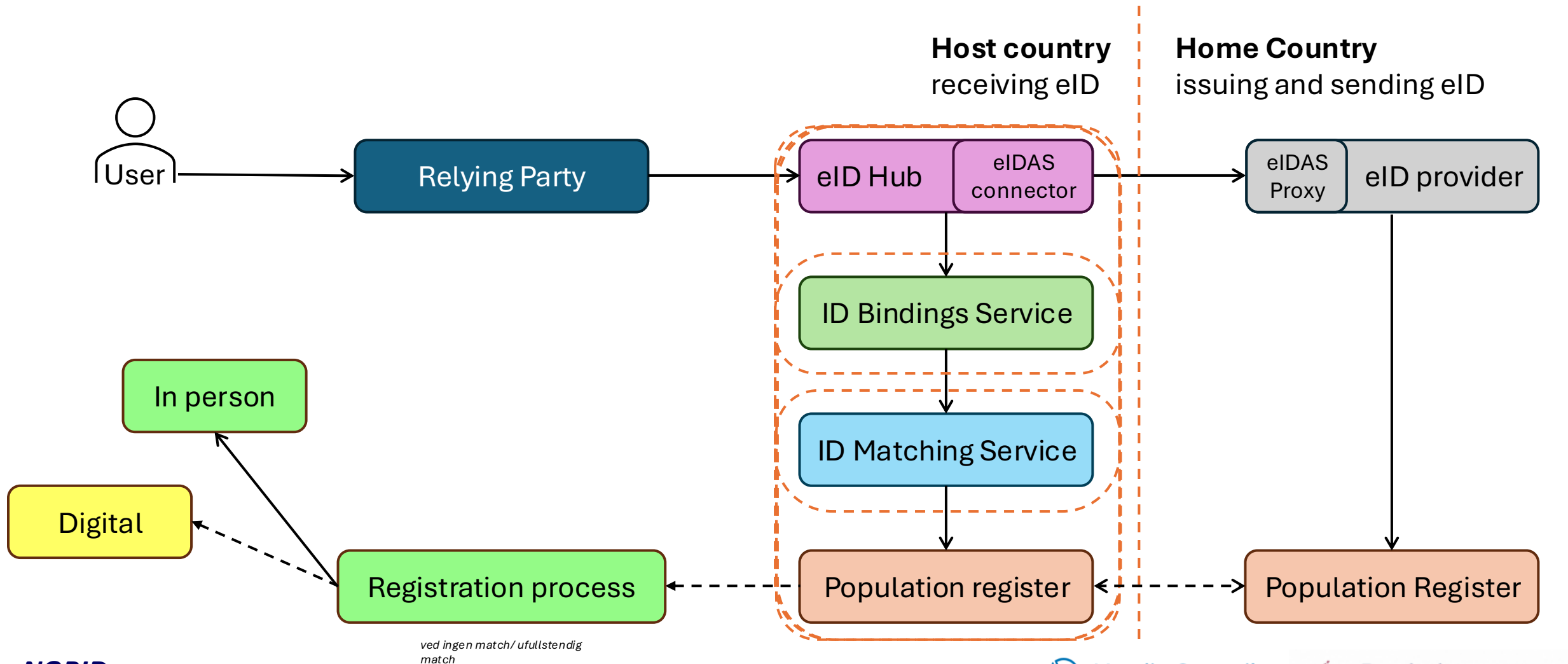
NOBID Identity Matching Project (a project in NOBID)

Who identity matching is relevant for

- All users who have been registered in another EU/EEA country and who need to access a service in that country for whatever reason
 - Seasonal workers, former foreign workers, commuters, students, pensioners, entrepreneurs
 - Public and private service providers
- Automatic solutions for IdM will make life easier for users, and save time and resource for individuals and institutions

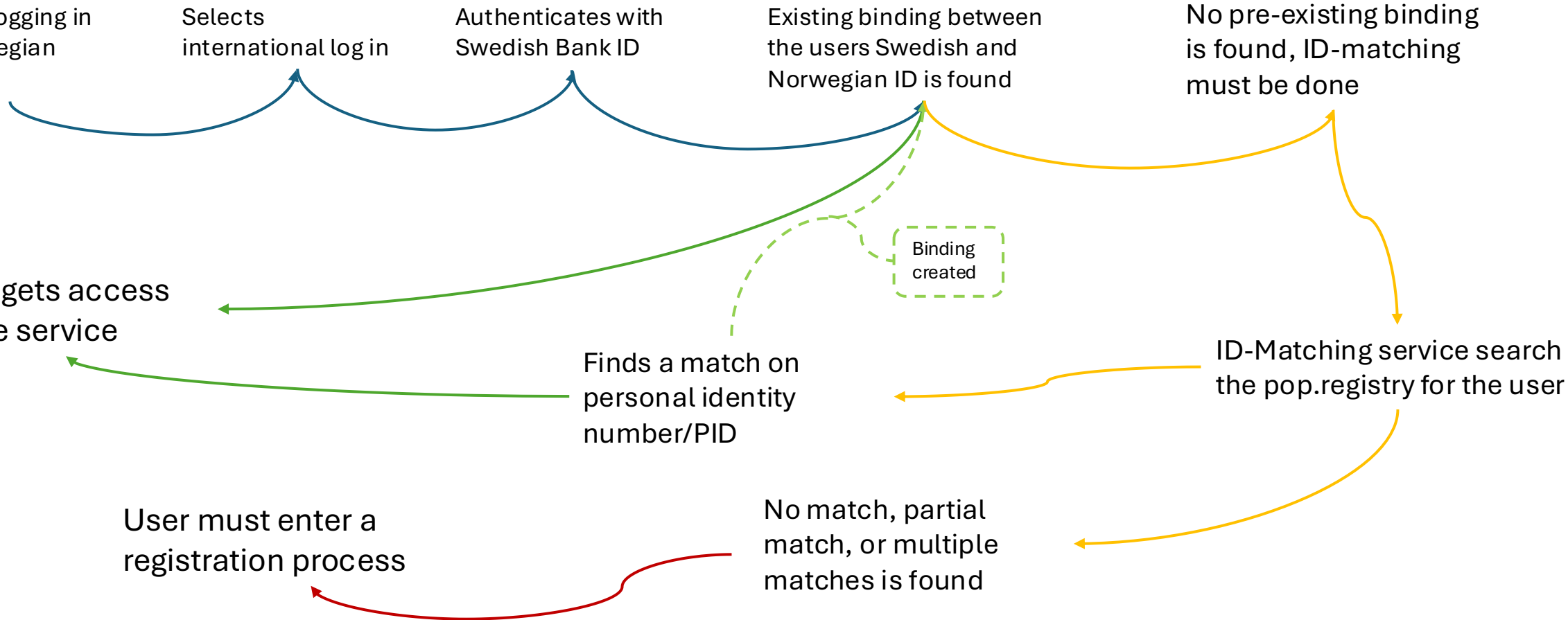

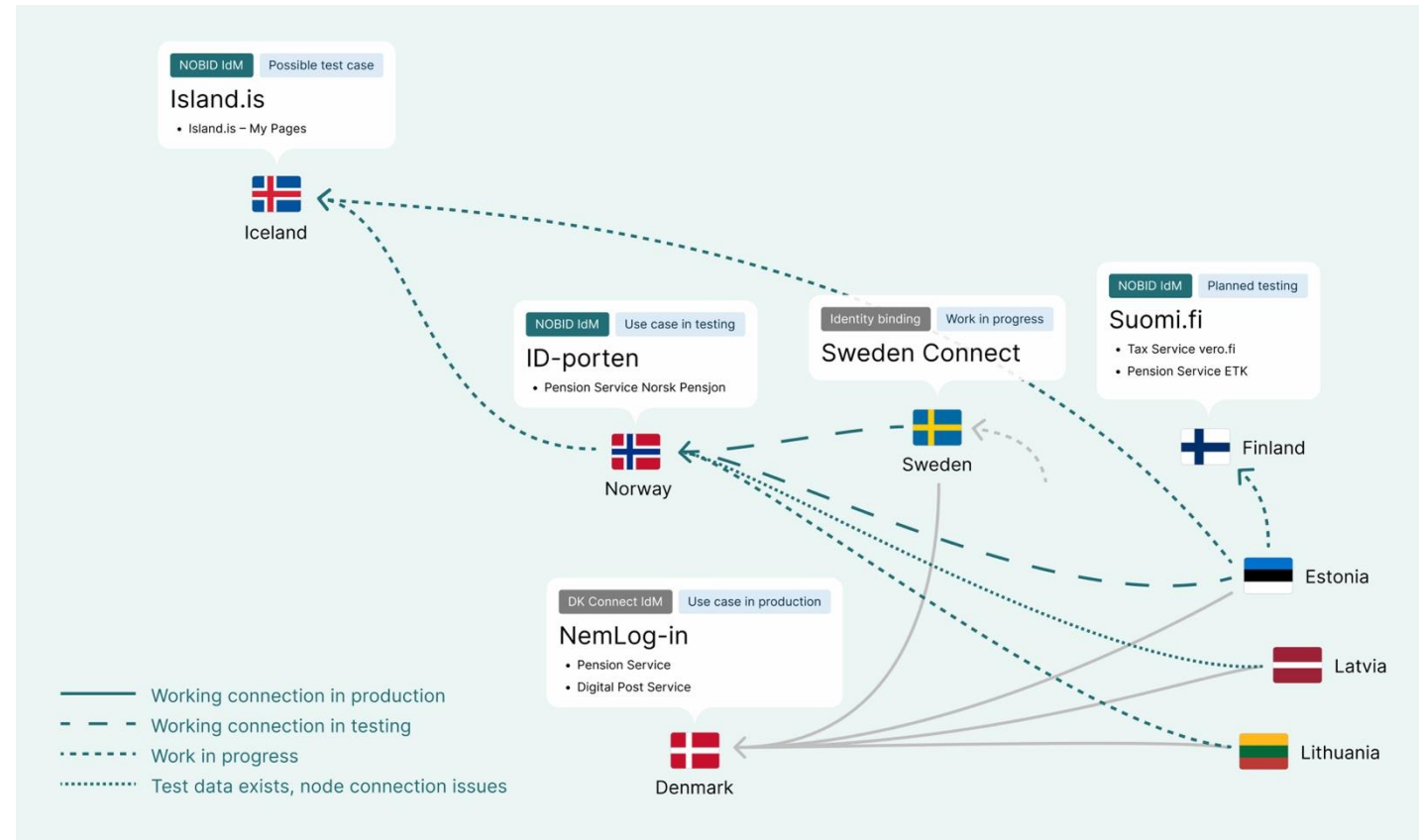

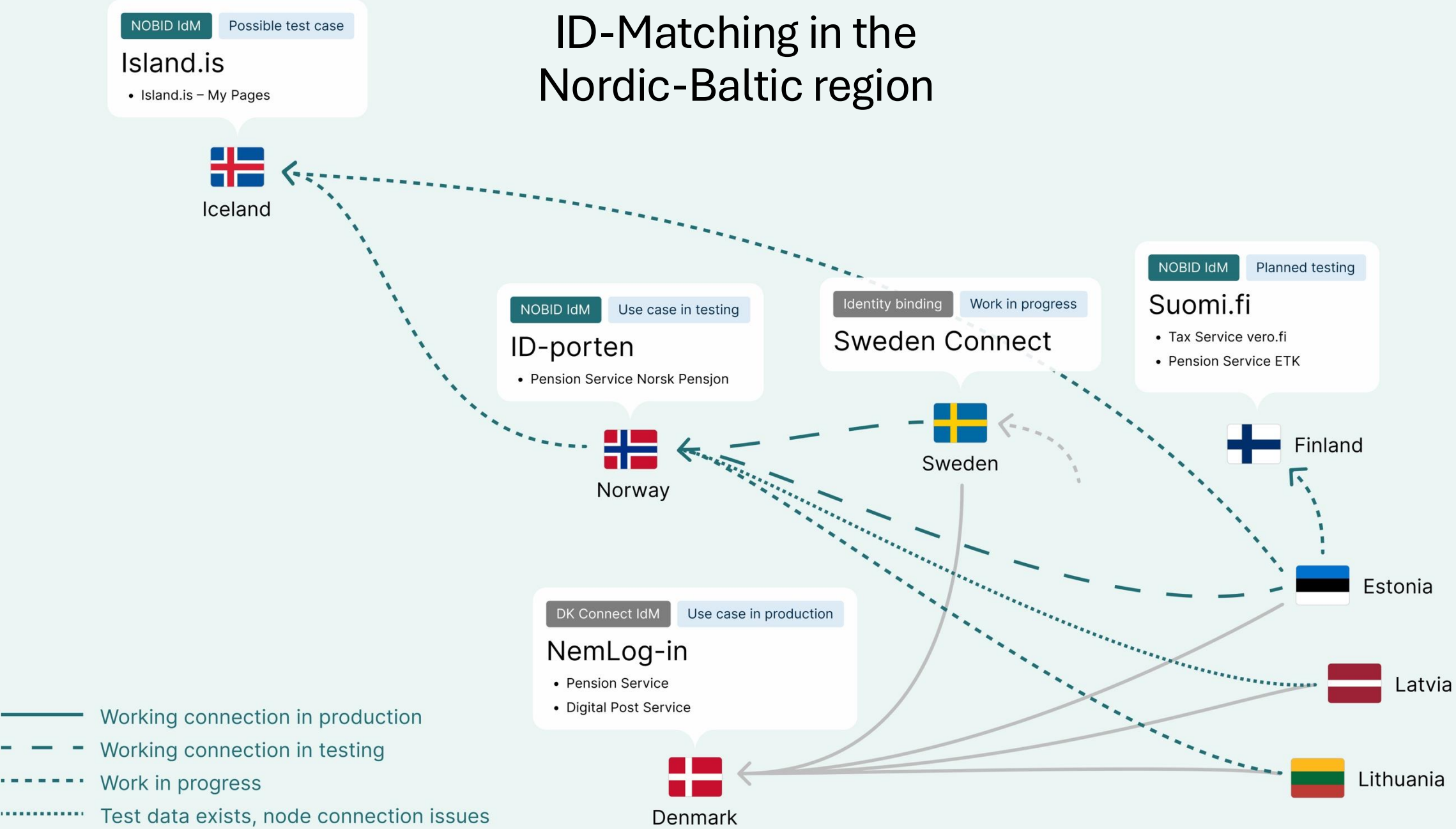


NOBID Identity Matching project

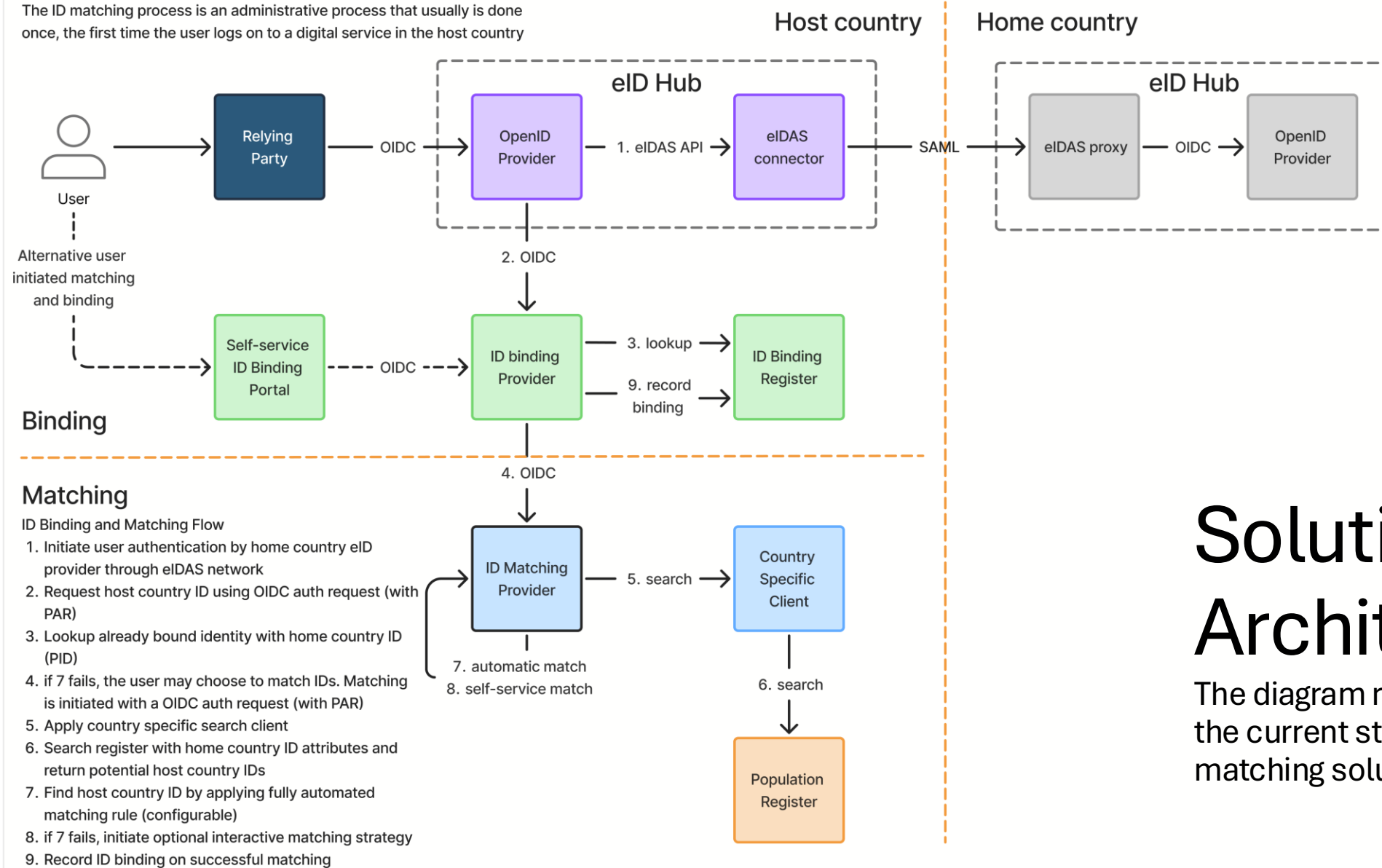
- Initiated Jan 2025
- Include digitalisation and population registry authorities
- Established to deliver real IdM solutions that the countries can adopt and reuse.
- Scope include both eIDAS 1.0 and eIDAS 2.0
- IdM Prototype delivered, working solution between Norway's test population register, Norwegian eID hub, Sweden connect, and Norwegian pension portal.
- Plan to expand testing, and move towards piloting with additional countries, use cases, and RP



ID-Matching in the Nordic-Baltic region



The ID matching process is an administrative process that usually is done once, the first time the user logs on to a digital service in the host country

The diagram represent our goal, not the current state of the NOBID ID matching solution



How to achieve a constructive matching result

You'll need a test user with

- a digital ID from one country (the home country)
- a corresponding record in the population register of the country you want to access (the host country)

i To facilitate the exploration of various ID matching scenarios, we have prepared a set of Swedish test users that will match in Norway as host country, but you are free to explore outside these boundaries.

Select host country

Host countries whose population registers are currently available for ID matching in the sandbox.



Norway / Folkeregisteret (Tenor)



Host country: Norway

A common use case for Norway as host country is foreign workers, especially from Sweden and Poland, logging in to access employment records or tax information.

Select eIDAS version

The matching can be done through both eIDAS 1.0 and 2.0. The processes are somewhat different, so feel free to test both.
